### **Sports Premium**

Sports Premium is Government funding which is given to primary schools to improve the quality of sport and PE for all children. This money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in school.

The impact of this funding is measured against 5 key indicators:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

At Poplar Farm School we aim to use the Sports Premium grant to

- Improve fitness, health and well-being, children will participate in a range of traditional and non-traditional sports and health enhancing activities through the curriculum, clubs and school visits.
- Promote active participation through inspiring and varied activities
- Allow each child to fulfil their potential, all children will benefit regardless of sporting ability
- Improve the quality of teaching and learning in physical education, staff will have access to resources and training opportunities and continued professional development to ensure that PE is taught to the highest standards

Possible uses for fund include;

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

Our PE and Sport Action Plan shows how we intend to spend the sports funding during 2018–2019.

We are continuously reviewing the impact of our primary sport premium action plan, through consultation with staff, children, parents and governors.
