and we treat them with fairness and honesty. We endeavour to enable each child to be successful and we provide equal opportunities for all in our school. We value our environment and we aim, through our curriculum, to instil a sense of understanding and responsibility for our world and how that will impact on future generations as well as our own.

Topic

Our topic work will centre around the stories we will be reading as part of our Literacy. Our key topic texts this term are Super potato, Super Pea, Super Daisy, Little Leaders and as we approach Christmas, The Nativity and The Jolly Christmas Postman.

We will have lots of challenges relating to superheroes and our key texts. These include; thinking about what makes us super, making potions outside to give us super powers, designing and making traps and investigating to help to find evil pea. As we get closer to Christmas, we will be making Christmas Cards and writing letters to loved ones.

Literacy

In phonics groups, we will continue to learn our Set 1 sounds as well as starting on some of our trickier set 2 sounds. Some children will be starting to read ditties and Read Write Inc stories to help support their reading development.



- In class we will be exploring writing lots of labels and captions, as well as creating story maps linked with The Jolly Christmas Postman and Supertato.
- We will be continuing to take part in helicopter stories to aid communication and language development and support story telling skills.

Maths

- Children will continue to develop their knowledge and understanding of the number system, focusing on number recognition of numbers up to 5, ordering and writing numbers.
- We will be developing their understanding of addition and subtraction through the part, part, whole model and 5 frames.
- They will use 2D and 3D shapes to create models and pictures related to our topic.



Children will learn to use a wide range of apparatus and use both standard and non-standard units when measuring.

Home learning

- Read, read, read!! If you have read one of your child's reading books or they've read a bed time story, please fill in the reading records, we love to read your comments. Any home learning can be shared with us using tapestry we really do love to see what you have been up to at home!
- Create a police station, fire station or hospital to help others.
 Can you add signs, make name tags and count and order all the vehicles?
- Play matching games to match the people who help us to the correct job, outfit or vehicles.

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about Celebrating Difference by including others when working and playing, trying to solve problems, using kind words and knowing how to use and give compliments.
