Year 1 Spring 1 - Have you seen an alien?







As Poplar mathematicians we will be continuing to develop our knowledge and understanding of place value, addition and subtraction. We will also introduce the children to the concept of measurement.

- Addition and subtraction to 20
- Place Value using numbers up to 50.
- Measurement length and height.
- Measurement weight and volume.

We will be exploring these concepts through the use of practical resources such as numicon, base 10 and part whole models.

As Poplar scientists, we will be exploring materials. We will begin by reviewing materials that we already know, then we will identify other types of material. We will also distinguish between an object from the material which it is made. Finally we will describe the properties of materials and use this to compare them.

In art we will be using water colour paints and learning new techniques for shading. We will use these techniques to create artwork inspired by the story 'Papa, please get the moon for me.'

In DT lessons, we will be making moon buggies. To achieve this we will be learning about the mechanism of wheels and axles.

The Children will be reading some non-fiction texts, all based around our space topic. The children will be using front covers and illustrations to infer about characters feelings and consider what the characters might be thinking and saying, including the aliens!

We will carry out role-play activities to support our writing. Including, being detectives asking questions to an alien, who's spaceship crash landed in the classroom, and becoming aliens, writing postcards to earth to describe our planet!

We will continue to work on structuring sentences, using capital letters, full stops/exclamation marks, and finger spaces. We will make sure that we re-read our writing to ensure it makes sense. We will learn how to write questions using question marks. When re-telling familiar texts, we will be writing descriptive sentences, with the use of adjectives.

In Geography the children will be exploring the globe. They will be recognising geographical features using satellite imagery. They will also be naming and locating the seven continents and five oceans. They will also be recognising different weather patterns across the world in relation to the Equator and the poles.

This term, in RE, the children will be focusing on community and belonging. They will consider the different communities that they belong to and how it makes them to feel to have a sense of belonging and identity to a group. They will explore the Christian ceremony of Baptism, and how this shows that a person is becoming a follower of Jesus and a part of the Christian family.

PSHE will focus on dreams and goals. The children will be setting their own goals and considering how they will achieve them.
