

# Year 1, Summer 1-Where have the butterflies been hiding?



Welcome to another fun-filled term in year 1. We have some many exciting projects taking place over the coming weeks. The projects that we will be undertaking will have a positive impact on the school for years to come! We will take part in lots of practical investigations including, planting sunflowers and recording our observations about their growth in our plant diary. We will also be growing butterflies in our class, when we have observed their growth we will release them into a butterfly garden in school which we are going to grow and develop ourselves. We will continue to record weather observations and seasonal changes in our monthly weather diary to see how the outdoor area and weather has changed through each season. We will also be busy taking part in lots of creative activities, such as water colour painting and planning important charity projects, linked to our RE learning.

## Key vocabulary

Community	A group of people with common interests that may or may not live together.

## Maths

As Poplar mathematicians, we will be focussing on addition and subtraction within 20, these are key skills which are essential for the children to be secure in. We will then be revisiting place value, involving numbers to 50. Once we have mastered these essential foundations we will be moving onto understanding the concepts of multiplication, division and fractions. We will introduce these new concepts through the use of objects, pictures and real-life scenarios.

## RE/PSHE

This term, in RE, the children will be focusing on community and belonging. They will consider the different communities that they belong to and how it makes them to feel to have a sense of belonging and identity to a group. They will understand how Christians feel to belong to religious community and church. They will begin to plan a community charity project to complete in the Summer term.

#### Creative

In art lessons, we will be exploring water colour painting techniques. We will experiment with shading, pigmentation and colour change using different amounts of water. The children will be exploring the different effects on flower petals.

In cooking lessons, we will be making mini breakfast frittatas. They will develop skills including the bridge and claw knife technique, grating and cracking eggs.

## Literacy

This term, in Literacy, the children will be reading 'The Day the Crayons Quit'. They will be writing their own letters, as if they are in one of the crayons in the story. In their letters, they will be using exclamation marks to express emotion, list writing and using conjunctions and adjectives. They will be writing persuasively to tell Duncan why they do not want to be used so much! They will then be reading 'The Tiny Seed' by Eric Carle, and will be using this to complete instruction writing, and write step by step instructions about how to plant a seed and care for a flower.

### Science

As Poplar scientists, we will be exploring the structure of plants and naming the different parts. We will also be exploring the local area to identify wild and garden flowers. We will use our new knowledge of plants to help us design and plant a garden to attract butterflies. This will be studied in conjunction with the exploration of mini- beasts, where we will observe and record the mini beasts that are in our local environment. We will use equipment to observe the structure of the animals and compare this to other animals we have studied. To end our topic, we will release our butterflies into our newly developed school garden.

## Geography

In Geography, we will continue to complete our weather log, and look at the changes between the months and seasons. We will use observation skills, to explore the changes around us, and any signs of Spring we might find!

#### The Poplar Promise
