COVID-19 updates

The government's plan sets out that at present that all staff and pupils should still isolate for a minimum of 5 days if they either have symptoms of COVID-19 or have had a positive test.

Although this is no longer a legal requirement, it remains government policy and guidance and one that is supported in school. Therefore, all students will be asked to remain at home, or return home, if they are either positive or have symptoms of COVID-19 - or other illness in line with normal practice.
